Motion by Gearhart to have Moler contact Dave Fox to check on the two chlorinators the Town of Whitten has for sale and to purchase them for a reasonable price. Second by Lutes. Carried.

Moler will check with Bill Hartwig to see if he can lower the shut off in the alley just south of Grundy by Jerry Vinton's apartments, so that it won't be damaged by the snow plow this winter. Lutes stated there is another shut off in front of Vinton's apartments that needs to be lowered.

Motion by Lutes to allow Moler up to a maximum of \$50.00 per month pick up expense for city business. Second by King. Carried.

The council discussed purchasing the police car that the city has been leasing and there was a motion by Lutes to purchase the '82 Plymouth Reliant police car for \$8600. from Friday's. Second by Gearhart. Carried.

Lutes stated that a warranty cannot be purchased on a police or fire vehicle, but that Friday's will furnish a written warranty on the newly purchased police car from Oct. 21, 1982 to October 21, 1983.

Lutes reported that he had received a call from Ruth Spicer as to all the signs and poles in her yard. She sited a stop sign, speed zone sign, a street light pole, utility pole, fire hydrant and a shut off all in her yard. Lutes requested that the speed sign be removed as there are four other speed zone signs on Washington Street and asking the light company to move the pole in her yard as it is rotting.

Gene Blythe would like Lutes and Mayor Daggett to look at the lift station in Grundy Center as that is the same type he wants to build in Conrad.

The council discussed several things that Bill Hartwig needs to do this fall. That is extend the drain in the park area at the west end of Grundy St., push the rock and debris over the incline so it can be covered and place a strip of concrete at the intersection of Washington and Lillian where the water line was put in.

The council discussed sewer rates again but at the present time could see no way to change the method of assessment.

The hauling of sludge by Kadner Farms was discussed. It was decided to leave the rate at \$750. a time or \$1500. a year.

King reported that Gloria Dielschneider asked that a four way stop sign be placed at the corner of Dwight and Grundy, the same as at Dwight and Maple. The council decided that at this time painting the crosswalks and posting yield to pedestrian signs from four ways would be sufficient. The clerk was asked to write a letter to Superintendent Messerole and ask if the school would assume the responsibility of placing and removing the 4 way stop sign at Dwight and Maple at the specified times.

Motion by King to have the library pay for the service contract on their copy machine and to bill the city for their use of the machine. Second by Lutes. Carried.

Motion to adjourn by King, second by Graham. Carried.
