Motion by Graham, second by Lutes that the above bills be accepted and warrants drawn on the same, with the exception of \$80.50 of the bill from Watertower Paint & Repair. Motion carried.

Frier reported that the analysis of Well #1 showed iron bacteria but that it could be taken care of. He also stated that he will take care of the undermining of the spillway on the South Main Street bridge by sinking posts in the ground and filling the area with rock or dirt.

The clerk was asked to place an ad in the Conrad Record advertising for bids for a new well house for Well #1. Bids will be accepted until 12:00 noon on the 26th of July. Frier will supervise the tearing down of the old building.

Gearhart reported that the sewer line on Walnut will be cleaned toward the end of July by Municipal Pipe and Tool of Hudson.

Rock washing out of the drive south of John McNair's house is causing a drainage problem on South Main. McNair will visit with the neighbors and if all are willing Frier will use city equipment to do some grading there.

Frier will see that the curb and street is repaired in the 300 block on Washington and on Center Street in front of Ritchie's parking lot. A portion of curb and street need to be cut out and replaced. Also, Center Street at the intersection of Lincoln needs to be repaired. Frier will check with the county engineer on this.

Gearhart will get quotations from Friday's for the continued leasing of the police car and also for the purchase of the vehicle.

McNair stated that the fire department asks for a donation of \$100. for burning a house. The council thought this policy agreeable.

Cigarette permits were approved in a motion by Zern and second by Gearhart for the following: Casey's General Store, Charlie's Market, Thorman's Store, Conrad Pharmacy, Conrad Grove Recreation Club, Schleisman DX Station, RonDell Lounge and the Corral. Motion carried.

The council agreed that the policy of charging the County Conservation Board \$25.00 plus cost for spray used each time Wolf Creek Park was sprayed was appropriate.

There was a motion by Gearhart to authorize Frier to purchase a new push lawn mower and weed whip. Second by King. Motion carried. Gearhart stated that Ed Jebousek will submit a list of the building permits issued each month at the council meeting.

Mayor Daggett reported that he had had some inquiries as to exactly the location of the alley that runs north and south between Center and Walnut a half bl

Lutes reviewed the agreement between the City and Gene Blythe and discussed the points that had been changed. Mayor Daggett then signed the agreement. *Acopy is included in the minutes.*

Frier discussed the work that had been done at Well #3 and that a 10 h.p. pump had been installed instead of the 5 h.p. that was in the well. This will pump 135 gallons per minute.

Frier is to notify Gary Moler Sanitation to leave a dumpster at the City shop. The cost will be \$216.00

Mayor Daggett asked Frier if he would see if the weeds in the park area of the Blythe Addition could be mowed with the rotary mower on the tractor.

Well house specifications were reviewed. It was decided to use *5/8 plywood* on the interior and also to install a power vent.

The burning of garbage was again discussed. It was suggested that possibly mandatory garbage pickup would solve the problem.

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SPECIAL MEETING  
JULY 28, 1982

The meeting was called to order at 12 noon by Mayor Dilman Daggett in the council chambers.

Council members present: Bob Zern, Dorothy King, Bob Lytes, Bill Gearhart and Vane Graham.

Also present: Bill Grabe and Les Wolfe

Les Wolfe very briefly reviewed the water system report. Zern questioned the need for a new tower if several more wells were spaced around Conrad. Wolfe stated that the maximum gallonage couldn't be pumped very long in case of a fire. Mayor Daggett stated that because of age, Conrad's tower would need to be replaced before too many years anyway.

Wolfe stated that he felt something was needed in west Conrad in the future. Either the water main down the alley between Main and Washington or a main down Lillian west from Main.

There was a motion by Gearhart that the water mains not be installed under the streets at the alley crossings on Maple, Lillian and Grant Streets between Main and Washington. Second by Graham. Motion carried.

Graham made the motion to extend the 6 inch water main from Main to the alley west of Washington on Lillian Street. Second by Lutes. Motion carried.

There was some discussion with Bill Grabe about taking out the intake on the southwest corner of Lillian. The council was in favor of leaving the intake in.

Lutes stated it was his understanding from reading the Engineer's Agreement, that there would be an engineer on the project at all times. Wolfe and Grabe stated that there would be an inspector here at all times. This will be discussed with Dwayne Garber.

Gearhart was appointed to talk to a park board member about the hours at the swimming pool. He felt the pool was closed unnecessarily too often.
