Mayor Gearhart announced the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the possibility of taking over Hackberry Lane as a city street or to arrange a maintenance agreement with the residents.


The Mayor introduced John Cleary, Ryken Engineering, who cited Conrad's 1971 Comprehensive Plan, which recommends that Hackberry Lane would need to be an improved 25 foot wide street with a minimum 50 foot right-of-way, seal coated with curb and gutter in order for the city to take it over. Cleary estimated the cost at \$23,000.


Dr. Cathcart noted his main concern was to work out an agreement for a street light at the west end of the street and for the city to plow, sand and maintain the street.

After some discussion the residents of Hackberry Lane and the council agreed that the city would sand the street only and that the residents would pursue getting a street light installed.

The council visited briefly with Cleary about further expansion in the Blythe Addition. A special meeting was set for Nov. 15 with the council, Development Committee and the Planning and Zoning Committee to discuss the matter.

Motion to adjourn by Sanderson, second by Schiebel. Carried.
