Mayor Gier appointed J. L. Hesselhuus and the Street commissioner to purchase the lawn mower.

Moved by Gravenstein and seconded by Hesselhuus that hereafter the Council will issue licenses for only two beer parlors in the Town of Conrad.

Nayes: None.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Gravenstein that the Mayor publish a notice in The Record warning owners of all dogs in the town to keep them on their own premises, especially during the spring garden season. Carried.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Gravenstein that the Mayor publish a notice in the Record advising the Public to clean up their alleys and gutters of ashes and rubbish within 30 days, and if not done by June 1st, 1938, same will be done by the Street Commissioner and the cost thereof will be assessed to the property and certified to the County Auditor as a Special Tax. Carried.

Moved by Gravenstein and seconded by Hesselhuus to defer action on the proposal to paint the water tank until the next regular meeting of the Council. Carried.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Gravenstein to adjourn. Carried.

Council met in Regular Session at the Town Hall, with Mayor Gier and Councilmen Brockway, Crouse, Gravenstein, Hesselhuus, and Newton present.

Absent: None.

On being called to order promptly at 7:00 P.M. by the Mayor, the minutes of the regular meeting held on May 2nd, 1938, were read by the Clerk and approved as read.

The Town Treasurer's Monthly Report was presented, read by the Clerk, approved, and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Gravenstein and seconded by Hesselhuus that the Clerk issue a warrant to the Conrad Cemetery Association for \$88.07, which represents the Spring Taxes received from the County Treasurer in the Cemetery Fund.
Carried.

The following Resolution was then presented to the Council:

"BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CONRAD, IOWA:

That all of the Streets and Avenues within the corporate limits of the town are hereby ordered oiled and the entire costs thereof, except the expense of oiling the intersections, shall be assessed to the abutting property according to the benefits conferred thereby. The oiling to be done by the Municipality and the benefits assessed in accordance with the state law providing for the oiling of streets and assessing the costs to the abutting property benefited."

Moved by Crouse and seconded by Brockway that this Resolution be adopted. The roll was called, and the following vote resulted: Ayes; Brockway, Crouse, Gravenstein, Hesselhuus, and Newton. Nays; None.

Mayor Gier then declared the Resolution adopted unanimously.

The Clerk then read a tentative Contract and Agreement with the Iowa Road Building Company, of Des Moines, tendering a proposal for furnishing road oil and spreading the oil on the streets and intersections of the Town of Conrad.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Hesselhuus that the Council accept the proposal of the Iowa Road Building Co., of Des Moines, to furnish and spread 6000 gal. of No. 2 Special Road Oil @ 6.68¢ per gal and that the Clerk be instructed to order this out immediately. Carried.

The Mayor instructed the Street & Alley Committee to arrange for the necessary sand for this oiling.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Crouse that the Water Tower Paint & Repair Company, Box #73, La Porte City, Iowa, be hired to paint the inside of the water tank for a lump sum of \$95.00
Carried.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Brockway that the applications for Cigarette Licenses presented by E. L. Piper, I. A. Cohen, and Anna Haws all be approved and the Clerk be authorized to issue the proper licenses upon receipt of the required fee. Carried.

The following Resolution was then presented to the Council:

"BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF CONRAD, GRUNDY COUNTY, IOWA:

That the Incorporated Town of Conrad issue its negotiable bonds to the extent of \$3,500.00 consisting of five in number in denominations of \$700.00 to be numbered consecutively from one to five inclusive, to be dated July 1st, 1938, and to mature as follows;- Bond Number One, July 1st, 1940; Bond Number Two, July 1st, 1941; Bond Number Three, July 1st, 1942; Bond Number Four, July 1st, 1943; and Bond Number Five, July 1st, 1944.

Said bonds to draw interest from date at the rate of four (4) percent per annum, payable annually July 1st of each year, with interest coupons attached to said bonds evidencing such interest payment obligation.

Such obligations shall be designated as "Water Works Bonds" and issued to secure funds to pay costs of extending water mains in the Town of Conrad in conformity with an affirmative vote of the electors of said town voting on the public question duly submitted at the regular municipal election held in said Town on the 28th day of March A. D. 1938."

Moved by Newton and seconded by Gravenstein that this Resolution be adopted. The roll was called and the following vote resulted; Ayes; Brockway, Hesselhuus, Gravenstein, Crouse, and Newton. Nays: None.

Mayor Gier declared the Resolution adopted unanimously.

Moved by Crouse and seconded by Newton to adjourn.
