The following bills were presented and on motion of E. O. Ecklund, seconded by L. G. Sherbon were allowed and warrants ordered drawn. S. O. Larson, \$6.00; Frank Steigerwalt \$37.50; F. D. Strickler, \$13.17; A. A. White, \$9.45; E. O. Ecklund, 1.00; Paul Larson, \$5/10; A. W. Poe, \$66.40...


Moved by Ecklund seconded by L. G. Sherbon that \$20.00 poll tax of 1917 be turned over to the town Treasurer by the Clerk.

Councilman E. M. Stark introduced and placed on its first meeting Ordinance No. 57.

Moved by E. O. Ecklund seconded by E. M. Stark that the Mayor and Water Comm. be and are hereby empowered to dispose of the old water tower,

The report by the treasurer was read and on motion was approved and placed on file.

Moved by E. O. Ecklund seconded by E. M. Stark that the Council do now adjourn to 10 o'clock A. M. August 20th. 1918.

Conrad, Iowa. Aug. 20, 1918.

Council met as per adjournment of Aug. 5th. 1918 to review objections to assessments on sewer system and for further consideration of the Plat and Schedule on same, there being present Mayor S. F. Price Clerk J. W. Beck, Councilmen, E. O. Ecklund, E. M. Stark, L. G. Sherbon, G. S. Beaman. Absent, John R. Gier, Town Engineer Frank Steigerwalt and Solicitor H. A. Willoughby, were also present. Objections to sewer assessments were filed by the following persons: E. L. Guild and J. H. Bates,

The Council then gave consideration to all objections and on motion and second the assessments were changed on the following properties:- J. H. Bates assessment was reduced from \$786. to \$13.16.

Councilman E. O. Ecklund then presented a resolution and moved its adoption, said motion being seconded by Councilman E. M. Stark. The roll was ordered called resulting as follows:- Ayes, E. M. Stark E. O. Ecklund, L. G. Sherbon, G. S. Beaman. Nays, None. Absent or not voting, J. R. Gier,. The resolution was declared adopted and was as follows: -

#### RESOLUTION OVERRULING OBJECTIONS.

Whereas notice as by law required has been given that a Plat and Schedule marked "Assessment Schedule, Conrad, Iowa, May, 1918/" showing the streets, parts of streets, and parcels of property and separate lots of parcels of ground, or specified portion thereof, subject to assessment for the sewer system constructed under contract with Cole Bros. of Ames, Iowa, dated August 28-1917, the names of owners thereof as far as practicable and the amount to be assessed against each lot or parcel of ground was on file in the office of the Town Clerk of said town and that within twenty days after the first publication thereof all objections thereto or to the prior proceedings on account of errors, irregularities or inequalities must be made in writing and filed with the town Clerk, and that the Town Council, after the expiration of the said twenty days at a special meeting called for that purpose, held thereafter, having heard such objections should then make the special assessments as shown in said plat and schedule as corrected and approved, and

Whereas, said twenty days has elapsed and the Town Council having

met at a special meeting this 20th. day of August 1918 and having heard and considered all objections pertaining to said improvement.

Therefore, be it resolved by the Town Council of the Town of Conrad, Iowa, that the following corrections be made in said plat and Schedule to-wit:- Assessment of J. H. Bates reduced from \$786.00 to \$613.16 and that all other objections be and the same hereby are overruled and said plat and schedule as thus corrected is hereby approved.

RESOLUTION CONFIRMING ASSESSMENT AND LEVYING SAME.

Whereas, the sewer system consisting of sewer, sewer-outlet and disposal plant heretofore ordered by the Town Council of the Town of Conrad on the 27th. day of July 1918 in the town of Conrad, Iowa, and constructed under a contract with Cole Bros. of Ames, Iowa, of date August 28, 1917, has been completed and was on the \_\_\_ day of

approved and accepted by the town council; and, Whereas, there is now on file for public inspection in the office of the Town Clerk of said town a plat and schedule showing the separate lots or parcels of ground, or specified portions thereof, subject to assessment for such improvement, the names of the owners thereof, as far as practicable, and the amount to be assessed against each lot or parcel of ground, which plat and schedule was on the 20th. day of August, 1918 approved and accepted by the Town Council; and Whereas, due notice has been given as by law required by posting of notices, there being no newspaper published in the town of Conrad, and by handbills posted in conspicuous places along the line of such improvement that said plat and schedule is on file in the office of the Town Clerk and that within twenty days after the first publication all objections thereto or to prior proceedings on account of errors, irregularities or inequalities must be made in writing and filed with the said Town Clerk; and

Whereas the Town Council, after the expiration of said twenty days, having met on the 20th. day of August 1918 and having considered all objections pertaining to said improvement and made corrections in said plat and schedule and overruled all others; Therefore, Be it resolved by the Town Council of the Town of Conrad, Iowa, that the several assessments against the property as specified in said plat and schedule, as corrected, and proposed thereby be, and the same are hereby, confirmed, and there is hereby assessed and levied a special assessment for the said improvement against each of said lots or parcels of ground as shown by said corrected plat and schedule. The amounts of said special assessments against each of said lots or parcels of ground is fixed and confirmed at the amount as shown by said plat and schedule as corrected and shall bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum, payable as by statute provided from the date of the acceptance of said work on 1918. The separate lots or parcels of ground so assessed for such improvement, situated in Conrad, Grundy County, Iowa., and the name of the several owners, as far as practicable, and the amount assessed against each lot or parcel of ground are as follows, to-wit:-

Be it further resolved that if the owner of any lot or parcel of land embraced in this assessment shall, within thirty days from the date of such assessment, promise and agree in writing endorsed on any bond or certificate issued in anticipation of such assessment or in a separate agreement, that, in consideration of having the right to pay his assessment in installments, he will not make any objections of illegality or irregularity as to the assessment or levy of such tax upon and against his property and will pay said assessment with interest thereon at the rate of 6% per annum, such tax so levied shall be payable in seven equal installments, the first of which, with interest on the whole assessment shall mature and be payable on the date of such assessment, and the others, with interest on the whole amount unpaid, annually thereafter, at the same time and in the same manner as the March semi-annual payment of ordinary taxes, but where no such promise and agreement in writing shall be made by the owner of any lot or parcel of land within said time

Whereas, there is now on file in the office of the Town Clerk a plat and schedule of the above improvement showing the separate lots or parcels of ground, or specified portions thereof, subject to assessment for such improvement, the names of the owners thereof as far as practicable and the amount to be assessed against each lot or parcel of ground, which said plat and schedule was on the 20th. day of August 1918 changed, corrected and then approved and accepted by the Town Council and the assessments as then shown by said plat and schedule were duly levied and assessed and a special tax for said improvement levied against each of the said lots or parcels of ground as shown by said corrected plat and schedule, and

Whereas, the contract between the said town of Conrad and the said Cole Brothers above referred to provided that assessment certificates should be issued to said Cole Brothers for the special tax or assessment so levied against said lots or parcels of ground;

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved by the Town Council of the Town of Conrad, Iowa:

That there be, and there is hereby ordered, issued sewer certificates payable to Cole Brothers or assigns in the aggregate sum of \$14852.51 in part payment of the cost of construction of said sewer, sewer-outlet and disposal plant described in the certain resolution passes on this date, to wit August, 20th. 1918 assessing the cost of same, each of which certificates shall state the amount of the assessment made against the property therein described, and the name of the owner of same as far as known. Said certificates shall bear interest at the rate of six

Ordinance No. 57 was declared adopted and is as follows:-

#### ORDINANCE NUMBER FIFTY-SEVEN.

An ordinance Regulating the use of the Public Sewer, and to Prescribe Rules and Regulations for the Connecting Buildings with Sewers, or the Construction, Reconstruction, Alteration and Repair of Plumbing and House Drainage Systems in Buildings in the Town of Conrad, Iowa, and the Issuance of Licences and Permits Therefor; to Provide for Inspection of Such Plumbing and House Drainage Systems, and for the Enforcing of Such Rules, and the Penalties for Violation, <sup>Be it</sup> ~~Be it~~ <sup>thery</sup> Ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Conrad, Ia.

## Section 1.

The Construction, repair and maintenance of all sewers, drains and cesspools, public and private shall be under the control and supervision of the Sewer Committee of the Town Council, and in addition to standing committees now authorized by Ordinance, the Mayor shall at the first meeting after his election or as soon thereafter as practicable appoint a sewer committee, consisting of three members of the Council, and designate the Chairman thereof.

## Section 2.

Any person desiring to make connection with the sanitary sewer system, shall first file with the town clerk an application therefore, setting forth the location and description of the property for which sewer connection shall be used. Upon approval of said application by the Clerk, the Clerk shall issue a permit to tap the sewer.

## Section 3.

No person shall tap any sewer at any other place than at the regular junction or "T" built in the sewer for that purpose, without a written permission from the majority of the members of the Sewer Committee of the Town Council, and all connections with the sewer system and service pipes shall be inspected by the Clerk before being covered and he shall keep a record of such connections in his office.

## Section 4.

Every person applying for a permit to make a sewer connection shall pay the Clerk, before such permit is issued, a fee of one dollar.

## Section 5.

All excavations or ditches dug in the streets or alleys shall be guarded so as to prevent injuries to persons and animals, and red lights shall be placed so as to give warning at night. All such excavations or ditches made in the making of any sewer connection shall be replaced in as good condition as before removal thereof, and to the satisfaction of the Clerk.

## Section 6.

Any lot owner desiring to make connection with public sewer from a lot or premises not located on said sewer and which was not subject to special assessment therefor, shall pay a sum for said connection equal to the special assessment on like premises, which sum shall be paid before the permit is issued.

## Section 7.

No eaves troughs or steam pipes, surface drains, nor storm water drains, shall be connected with the public sewer and it shall be unlawful to throw or deposit or permit to pass into the public sewer any garbage, vegetable parings, ashes, cinders rags or any other material or thing except faeces, urine, the necessary water, closet toilet paper, and liquid house slops. And cellar drains may be connected if properly trapped and screened.

## Section 8.

No person shall open or enter the flush tanks or manholes connected with the public sewer except upon permit of the Town Council or Sewer Committee thereof.

## Section 8.

Except upon special permit of the Town Council or Sewer Committee thereof, but one dwelling or building shall be served by one sewer connection.

## Section 10.

All connections to the public sewer shall be made by or under the

direction of a competent person licensed by the Town as hereinafter provided, and upon it being made to appear to the Mayor that any person licensed under this Ordinance has violated any of the provisions hereof, or the orders of the sewer committee, or the condition of his bond the Mayor may revoke said license.

#### Section 11.

Persons making connections to the public sewer shall execute to the town of Conrad a bond with two sufficient sureties to be approved by the Mayor, in the penal sum of \$1000.00 conditioned to hold the Town free and harmless on account of any damages sustained by the Town or any person by reason of excavations or obstructions in the streets or alleys, or negligence of any kind in the making of said connection. Upon execution of bond as required the Mayor shall issue a license in the name of the Town of Conrad running not less than one year, and the license fee shall be \$10.00 per year.

#### Section 12.

Materials -- All materials for house drains and sewers must be of good quality and free from defects and imperfections, and all work must be executed in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and said work and material shall be subject to the inspection and approval of the Town Clerk.

#### Section 13.

Outside Drain Pipes.-- The drain pipe from the public sewer up to within three (3) feet of the foundation wall of the building shall be of glazed earthenware sewer pipe or cast iron pipe four inches inside diameter except where the sewer has a larger sewer connection. All pipes up to the lot line shall be the same size as the connection provided in the sewer, and no drain shall contain a reducer in its entire length, except on application the sewer committee may grant a special permit authorizing such a reduction to be made under the direction of the sewer committee. The pipes shall be given a regular gradient of not less than one-fourth of an inch per foot if possible, and shall be laid with joints calked with an oakum or hemp gasket and good Portland cement packed well into the hubs, with the inside of all joints and pipe left perfectly smooth and clean.

#### Section 14.

Inside Drain Pipes.-- The drain pipe within the building, from a point three feet outside the foundation, must be of heavy cast iron pipe of a minimum inside diameter of four inches. It must be laid as straight as possible with a gradient of not less than one-fourth of an inch per foot, making changes of direction with curves, and making all connections with "Y" branches and one-eighth or one-sixteenth bends. "T"s to be used on vertical soil pipes only.

#### Section 15.

Soil Pipes, Material. Size.-- The main waste or soil pipes must be of sound cast iron or lead, not less than four inches in diameter, and shall not decrease in size, but be carried up through the building full size.

#### Section 16.

Soil Pipes, Traps.-- No trap or other obstruction to the free flow of air through the whole course of the sewer or soil pipes will be permitted unless, however, an independent four inch ventilation pipe extending upwards through the house or building is provided for ventilating the street sewer.

#### Section 17.

Cleanouts.-- All Cleanouts shall be of the same diameter as pipe, and shall be provided with gastight screw covers and proper ferrules calked into the iron pipe with oakum and lead. All vertical lines of soil pipe shall have a cleanout at foot of pipe. Cleanouts shall be placed at all changes of direction of sewer or soil pipe, also at the ends of each horizontal line and at each junction.

## Section 19.

Ventilation Pipes, -- Material-Size, etc. All ventilation pipes must be of lead, extra heavy cast iron or brass, and must be run with as continuous a grade and as few bends as possible, and shall not vary more than forty-five degrees from vertical. The area of the main vent must be increased as it passes upward so as to be equivalent to the combined areas of all the branch vent pipes passing into it, and no vent pipe shall be less than two inches in diameter, except for short lengths. All back vent pipes from traps shall be run separately up through the roof or be connected into the soil pipe at least one foot above the highest fixture. In no case must a vent or soil pipe open near to a window or air shaft used for the ventilation of living rooms. Chimneys or other flues must not be used as ventilators.

## Section 20.

Pipes. Inspection.-- All drain, soil and waste pipes and their traps must, if possible, be exposed to view, for ready inspection at all times.

## Section 21.

Pipes. Connections.-- All connections of lead pipes shall be wiped joints. Connections between lead and iron pipe must be made with extra heavy brass ferrules wiped into the lead pipe and calked into the iron pipe with a leaded joint. All openings in sewer, soil or vent pipes must be closed by plugs, screwed, calked or wiped in. All vent connections and anti-syphon connections to and from traps must be made with brass union couplings.

## Section 22.

Traps, Where Placed.-- Every fixture must be separately and effectually trapped. All traps must be placed as close to the fixtures to which they belong as possible, and must in no case be more than two feet away, and must be of such size that all parts of the trap will be thoroughly flushed with each discharge. All traps must be prevented from syphonage by being ventilated by a special air vent pipe taken out of the crown of the trap, except where anti-syphon fixtures or devices which render the vent pipes unnecessary are used; which fixtures or devices shall first be approved by the Clerk.

## Section 23.

Grease Traps.-- Slop sinks, kitchen sinks and pantry sinks in all hotels, restaurants, eating houses and all public cooking or laundry establishments must be provided with and connected to a grease trap of approved pattern. The use of grease traps is recommended for all dwellings.

## Section 24.

Waste Pipes.--All waste pipes and traps for kitchen sinks and laundry tubs or trays must be not less than one and one-half inches internal diameter, and those from lavatories and bath tubs must be not less than one and one-fourth inches internal diameter. All waste pipes from fixtures, other than water closets, must be provided with strong metallic strainers at the outlets of such fixtures to exclude from said pipes all substances likely to obstruct them. Overflow pipes from fixtures must in each case connect on the inlet side of the trap of the same fixture. The water pipes from a refrigerator, if drained into the sewer, shall not be directly connected with soil or waste pipe, but shall discharge into an open sink provided with a trap having at least a three-inch water seal, and so arranged as to admit of frequent flushing.

## Section 25.

Water Closets, Requirements.-- Water closets must never be placed in an unventilated room or compartment; and in every case the compartment must be open to the outer air or be ventilated by means of a shaft or air duct with at least four square feet of area for each room opening into such shaft.

## Section 25. Con.

No pan, valve, plunger, offset, washout closet, or other water closet having an unventilated space, or no water closet whose walls are not thoroughly flushed at each discharge will be permitted.

All water closets shall be supplied from special tanks, the water from which shall be used for no other purpose. The supply pipe from tank to water closet shall not be less than one and one-fourth inches internal diameter.

## Section 26.

Urinals. Requirements.-- All urinals must be provided and connected with automatic flushing tanks. No metallic lined urinals will be allowed in any building.

## Section 27.

Urinals. Drains.-- Every safe under a sash basis, Bath, urinal, water closet or other fixture must be drained by a special pipe not directly connected to any scil, waste or drain pipe, but discharging into an open sink on the cellar floor or outside of building, unless some approved device or means are provided for maintaining a perfectly sealed trap at all times.

## Section 28.

Any violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars, and in case the fine and costs imposed for such violation are not paid, the person convicted may be committed to jail until such fine and costs are paid, not to exceed thirty days.

## Section 29.

This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and posting as provided by law.

The foregoing Ordinance was duly passed and adopted by the town Council of Conrad, Iowa, at an adjourned meeting held on the 20th, of August, 1918 and same is hereby approved by me.

Motion by Eckland and second by Gier that the clerk certify to the County Auditor a list of unpaid sewer assessments including those who signed wavers, and another list of unpaid sewer assessments showing those not signed wavers, carried.

Moved by Eckland and second by Stark that the report of the treasurer be accepted, carried.

Moved by Gier second by Eckland that the clerk be instructed to pay the \$500.00 water bond due November 1st, carried.

Motion by Eckland and second by Gier that the clerk and treasurer be instructed to retire up to \$1500.00 water bonds as soon as possible, carried.

Motion by Eckland and second by Gier to adjourn, carried.
