At this time a representative of the Claude P. Hooker Supply Co., of Marshalltown, Iowa and I. A. Cohen our local Fire Chief meet with the Council in regard to new Fire equipment. After more or less consideration motion was made by J. L. Hesselhuus seconded by Calvin Crouse that a contract be made with the Hooker Co., for the equipment as outlined by their agent (Cahsis not to be included) Motion prevailed with no dissenting voice.

Following Resolution was then presented, read and on motion by Calvin Crouse seconded by J. L. Hesselhuus adopted -the resolution to be published in the Conrad Record two issues:-

RESOLUTION AND CONTRACT
BETWEEN THE TOWN OF CONRAD, IOWA, AND THE SUBSCRIBERS TO COMMUNITY
FIRE PROTECTION FUND.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Town of Conrad, Iowa, that in consideration of subscriptions to the Community Fire Protection Fund, the town will maintain the fire apparatus and equipment so purchased, and will render fire protection service to all subscribers during the life of the apparatus and equipment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That in the event additional subscribers shall desire fire protection after the purchase price of the apparatus and equipment has been fully subscribed, this Council may accept subscriptions for fire protection upon such terms and conditions and upon payment of such fee as shall be demanded by this body.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That each member of the Association shall receive a certificate to the effect that he or she is a member of the Community Fire Protection Association, and as such is entitled

to fire protection, which certificates shall be subscribed by the Mayor and Clerk on behalf of the town.

Council meet at the City Hall in special session as per motion made at the adjournment of the last meeting.

Present at Roll call: Mayor R. C. Shoup, who called the meeting to order and D. M. Larson Clerk, who recorded the minutes and the following Councilmen: Calvin Crouse, R.E.Newton, E.J.Brockway, Ray Gravenstein and J. L. Hesselhuus.

The oiling of the streets having been given consideration and after careful thought the following resolution was offered:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CONRAD?

Grundy County, Iowa :-

That the proposed assessments for the oiling Main Street from the C & N W Ry north to Lillian Avenue, Center Street from Main Street to Alice Street, one block on Washington Street north from Center Street, Two Blocks on Grundy Avenue, also two blocks on Church Street north of Center Street, also one and one-half blocks east of Main Street on Maple Avenue, three blocks east of Church Street on Grundy Avenue, which has been prepared by the Clerk and is now on file in his office, notices of which in compliance with the state law, be given all persons liable for such costs, be and the same is hereby levied against the property in accordance with the passage of this resolution and shall be certified by the Clerk, to the County Auditor, as a special tax against the property.

On motion of R. E. Newton seconded by Calvin Crouse the above resolution was passed, there being no dissenting votes and the amount of the assessments made as follows:

\$3.00 per benefit on Main Street, Center Street and one block on Washington Street and two blocks on Grundy Avenue, \$2.00 per benefit on Church Street, 1½ blocks east of Main Street on Maple Avenue, 3 blocks east of Church Street on Grundy Ave

The vote on the above resolution was as follows:

No one voting Nay the Mayor declared the resolution adopted.

On motion made by R. E. Newton, seconded by Ray Gravenstein the Clerk was instructed to issue permits for the coming year as follows:

Class B Beer Permits also Cigarette Permits to each of the following: I. A. Cohen, Dale Canon, E.L.Piper and a Cigarette Permit only to L. C. Horning. Permits to be dated July 1, 1936 and to expire July 1st 1937 if not previously cancelled by cancellation or otherwise.

Next in order of business came the selection of a Mayor to succeed R. C. Shoup, resigned.

No candidate for the position except Charles Clarke was known to the council so his name was placed in nomination

Nominations being closed Calvin Crouse was appointed teller, the ballot proving clear, he was declared the unanimous choice of the Council and was sworn in by Mayor Shoup and immediately assumed the duties of his office.

No further business coming before the meeting on motion the council adjourned
