On motion by Gould seconded by Martin that Frank Plambeck's applications and bonds for the sale of beer and cigarettes be approved and accepted. carried

On motion by Gravenstein seconded by Newton that Foster Wakefield ~~be~~ be refunded \$12.50 on his cigarette license. carried

On motion by Martin seconded by Clinite that the resignation of H.D. Hunt member of the Conrad Public Library be accepted. carried

On motion by Newton seconded by Martin that Paul Franzenburg JR. be appointed a member of the Conrad Public Library Board. carried

On motion by Newton seconded by Gould that approximately 900 feet of 2 inch copper pipe and sufficient fittings for outlets be purchased from McDonald Manufacturing Company of Des Moines for the alley between Shaw's 2nd. and 3rd. additions, or between Dwight and Vernon streets east and west and north and south between Center and Maple streets. carried

Councilman Newton introduced an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Amending Salary Ordinance No. 11, Entitled, "An Ordinance Providing For the Compensation Of Officers And Employees".

The ordinance was read the first time by the Clerk.

It was moved by Councilman Clinite and seconded by Councilman Gravenstein, "That the council shall dispense with the rule requiring that an ordinance shall be fully and distinctly read on three different days."

This motion was carried by a yea and nay vote as follows:-

Mayor Gough thereupon declared the ordinance adopted.

On motion by Gravenstein seconded by Newton that council adjourn. carried

At this time Mayor Gough appointed D.O. Clinite, H.D. Martin to act as clerks, J.D. Gould Ray Gravenstein and C.D. Newton as judges at the regular municipal election to be held at the Town Hall on March 29th. 1948. Town Clerk

At this time the Clerk reports that there were twelve regular and ten special meetings last year.

Mayor Gough missed only two meetings out of the (22) Councilman Clinite missed one meeting, Councilman Gould missed two meetings, Councilman Gravenstein missed three meetings, Councilman Martin missed three meetings, Councilman Newton missed six meetings out of the (22) while H.D. Hunt the Clerk was present at all twenty-two meetings.
