Immediately upon adjournment of the old Council the new Council met in regular session at the Town Hall.

On being called to order at 8:00 P.M. the following members were present: Councilmen Brockway, Crouse, Gravenstein, Hesselhuus, and Newton.

Absent: None.

Moved by Hesselhuus and seconded by Crouse that H. E. Frederick serve as Mayor until the newly elected mayor furnishes bond and qualifies. Carried.

Moved by Crouse and seconded by Hesselhuus that the appointment of I. A. Cohen as Chief and Leonard Loverin as Assistant Chief of Conrad's Volunteer Fire Department be approved by the Council. Carried.

Moved by Hesselhuus and seconded by Gravenstein that the Iowa Valve Company be hired to repair all the Iowa hydrants according to their written proposal now on file in the Clerk's office--25% of the cost of which is to be paid upon completion of the work and the balance in 6 months. Carried.

Moved by Hesselhuus and seconded by Crouse that Clifford C. Belz be appointed Town Clerk. Carried.

The Mayor appointed F. A. Prescott as Marshal, Dr. Geo. R. Gould as Health Physician, and R. C. Dickover as Street Commissioner.

Moved by Crouse and seconded by Brockway that the salary of the Marshal be raised to \$50.00 per month. Carried.

Moved by Brockway and seconded by Gravenstein that F. A. Prescott be appointed Night Watch. Carried.

The Mayor appointed R. C. Dickover as Water Superintendent at a salary of \$40.00 per month, with 35¢ per hour additional for labor as Street Commissioner.

Moved by Hesselhuus and seconded by Gravenstein that D. S. Rhine's Pool Room License be renewed for another year. Carried.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Brockway that the Town Clerk be delegated to collect the 1938 Poll Tax and that he be allowed a commission of 10% for collecting same. Carried.

Moved by Hesselhuus and seconded by Crouse that the bond required of the Town Treasurer be reduced from \$4,000.00 to \$2,000.00 Carried.

Moved by Gravenstein and seconded by Newton that J. L. Hesselhuus be designated as Weed Commissioner. Carried.

The following resolution was presented by the Clerk:

"BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CONRAD, GRUNDY COUNTY, IOWA:

That the First State Bank, of Conrad, Iowa, shall be the Depository for all town funds. The Town Treasurer is hereby instructed to deposit all town funds in said bank as soon as received by him and that no funds be paid out except on Orders issued by the Town Clerk."

Moved by Crouse and seconded by Newton that this Resolution be adopted. Carried.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Gravenstein that the Town Treasurer be allowed a salary of \$15.00 per year. Carried.

The following resolution was presented by the Town Clerk:

"BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CONRAD, IOWA:

1. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 4755-b29 of the Code and Chapter 154 of the Laws of the 47th General Assembly of the State of Iowa, we hereby approve and consent to the maintenance of all primary road extensions within said town during the calendar year 1938, by the State Highway Commission, as hereinafter set forth.

2. That the approval and consent herein given for the maintenance of said primary road extensions within the said town of Conrad is based on the assumption and understanding that said maintenance to be done by the State Highway Commission will be paid for by the State Highway Commission out of the primary road fund, and that no charge will be made against the town of Conrad on account

of such maintenance performed or to be performed by the State Highway Commission on said primary road extensions within the said town of Conrad.

3. That the maintenance to be done by the State Highway Commission on the primary road extensions within the town of Conrad shall include the usual surface maintenance, road-bed repairs, repairs to bridges, culverts and guard rail, and other maintenance usually performed on primary roads outside of cities and towns. That on streets or portions of streets which are curbed, the maintenance, except snow removal, shall extend from curb to curb. That the maintenance of such primary road extensions shall include plowing the snow from the full width of the pavement or other surfacing, provided that if the pavement or other surfacing is more than thirty feet in width, then the Highway Commission will plow the snow from a traveled way only about thirty feet in width.

4. That the maintenance of such primary road extensions by the Highway Commission shall not include:

(a) The loading and hauling away of snow which is plowed off to the side of the traveled portion of the roadway.

(b) The sprinkling of the streets.

(c) The sweeping of the streets.

(d) The maintenance or repair of any sewers, water pipes, or other services under the traveled surface of the roadway or any costs incident thereto.

5. That this resolution and the terms thereof shall become effective upon the approval and acceptance thereof by the Iowa State Highway Commission."

Moved by Crouse and seconded by Gravenstein that the foregoing resolution be approved and adopted. Carried.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Crouse to adjourn. Carried.
