Council met in adjourned session at the Town Hall, with Mayor Gier and Councilmen Brockway, Crouse, Gravenstein, Hesselhuus, and Newton present.

On being called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Mayor Gier, the minutes of the regular meetings held on April 3rd, 1939, including the Board of Review and Board of Health, the special meeting held on April 4th, 1939, and the regular meeting held on May 1st, 1939, were read by the Clerk and approved as read.

The Town Treasurer's Monthly Report for April, 1939, was presented, approved as read, and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Crouse and seconded by Gravenstein that the Clerk be authorized to issue a Town Warrant to the Conrad Cemetery Association for \$88.95, which represents the amount of Spring Taxes received from the County Treasurer in the Cemetery Fund. Carried.

Councilman Brockway introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption. Same was seconded by Councilman Hesselhuus:

RESOLUTION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF CONRAD, GRUNDY COUNTY, IOWA:

That the Town Treasurer and the Town Clerk are hereby authorized to credit the delinquent taxes received from the County Treasurer in the Consolidated Fund, amounting to \$104.49, and the Road Fund, amounting to \$2.00, and current taxes received in the Oiling Fund, amounting to \$40.70, totaling, in all, \$147.19, to the General Fund for the purpose of accounting and distribution.

Moved by Crouse and seconded by Gravenstein that the compensation of the Town Clerk for the ensuing year be set at \$20.00 per month, payable quarterly. Carried.

Mayor Gier appointed F. A. Prescott as Town Marshall and R. C. Dickover as Water Superintendent and Street Commissioner for the ensuing year.

Moved by Brockway and seconded by Gravenstein that F. A. Prescott be appointed Night Watch for the ensuing year. Carried.

Moved by Brockway and seconded by Crouse that the compensation of the Town Marshall and Night Watch for the ensuing year be set at \$60.00 per month, payable monthly, said compensation to include the care of the Fire Truck. Carried.

Mayor Gier appointed R. C. Dickover as Special Marshall to serve until June 1st, 1939.

Moved by Newton and seconded by Crouse that the compensation of the Water Superintendent for the ensuing year be set at \$30.00 per month, payable monthly, with 40¢ per hour additional for labor as Street Commissioner. Carried.

Moved by Hesselhuus and seconded by Gravenstein that the Town Clerk procure a supply of Traffic Tickets for use by the Town Marshall. Carried.

Councilman Newton introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption. Same was seconded by Councilman Hesselhuus.

#### RESOLUTION.

× "BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF CONRAD, GRUNDY COUNTY, IOWA:

That all of the Streets and Avenues within the corporate limits of the town are hereby ordered oiled and the entire costs thereof, except the expense of oiling the intersections, shall be assessed to the abutting property according to the benefits conferred thereby. The oiling to be done by the Municipality and the benefits assessed in accordance with the state law providing for the oiling of streets and assessing the costs to the abutting property benefited."

On call of roll, Councilmen Brockway, Crouse, Gravenstein, Hesselhuus, and Newton all voted "aye". Nays, None. Absent: None.

Wheeler as Town Treasurer, and the Continuation Certificate of the American Surety's Company's Bond #330376K for \$500.00 for Clifford C. Belz as Town Clerk, and the Continuation Certificate of the American Surety's Company's Bond #330377K for \$500.00 for John R. Gier as Mayor, all be approved and accepted by the Council. Carried.

Moved by Gravenstein and seconded by Crouse that the Town Clerk arrange for \$500.00 insurance on the Town's Grader House and \$1,000.00 insurance on the Town Hall. Carried.
