The Schenk Engineering Co. presented a preliminary report on the requirements of a sewage disposal plant for Conrad.

The following Resolution was presented to the Council:

RESOLUTION #22

WHEREAS, the need for a sewage treatment plant for the Town of Conrad is readily apparent; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government under the provisions of 33 U. S. C. 466 et seq. (the Federal Water Pollution Control Act) makes it possible for federal aid to be granted to municipalities qualifying under the act for the construction of sewage treatment plants; and it appears that the Town of Conrad can qualify for such federal aid and an application for a federal grant is in order at this time;

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED that Dale Friday, Mayor of the Town of Conrad be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to complete and execute the Application for Federal Grant for Sewage Treatment Works Under 33 U. S. C. 466 et seq. on Form PHS-2654, in triplicate, on behalf of the Town of Conrad, attaching thereto such statements and exhibits as may be required; and

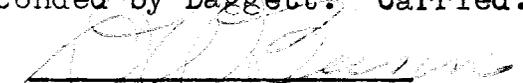
IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that if a Federal grant for the project is made pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, the Town of Conrad will pay the remaining cost of the approved project and the Town of Conrad will provide proper and efficient operation and maintenance of the approved project after completion of the construction thereof.
