


Lutes motioned to approve a cigarette license to Bogie and Bacalls, seconded by Mugge. Ayes-5.

The Conrad City Council met in regular session on 10-28-02 in Council Chambers. Answering roll call was Shauna Callaway, Bill Gearhart, Robert Lutes, LeAnn Lynch, and Steve Mugge. Also present was Jim Elliott, Elliot Construction; Steve Harris, Cessford Construction; Gary Sindelar, Ryken Engineering. Mayor Sanderson called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. and began with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Council reviewed Ordinance #230 "Adopting the Code of Ordinances for the City of Conrad, Iowa, 2002". Gearhart motioned to accept the second reading and to waive the third reading of Ordinances #230, Mugge seconded and roll was as follows. Ayes- Gearhart, Callaway, Mugge, Lynch, Lutes. Nays: none. Lutes then motioned to adopt Ordinance #230 and Gearhart seconded. Ayes- Gearhart, Callaway, Mugge, Lynch, Lutes. Nays- none. Ordinance #230 will become effective upon publication.

Council then discussed a drug and alcohol program for City Employees required to have a CDL. They agreed to use DATA, which is a consortium of local government employers. The initial cost to join the program is \$100 and then \$30 per year, plus the expense of the random testing.


Gary Sindelar, Jim Elliott and Steve Harris discussed with Council the Duesenberg Drive paving project. Council reviewed their options for correcting the unevenness of the asphalt on Duesenberg Drive. The Street Committee is to report back at the next meeting with a recommendation for Council to consider.

Under other business City Clerk Hoy reviewed with Council new regulations for accounting procedures being passed on by the State Auditors Office. The City must be compliant with GASB34 reporting measures by 2004. Along with the GASB34 compliance, the cities chart of accounts and budget forms will also under go changes. Hoy will be attending various meetings to become educated on the subjects.

Council also reviewed a new Building/Zoning permit application presented by Clerk Hoy and the second draft of the Business Interest Buy-Down Program (BIBP) presented by Council Member Lutes.

With no further business, meeting was adjourned by motion at 8:06 p.m.
