Special Meeting
August 3, 1995

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Gearhart at 9:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

Council members present: Lutes, Case, Sanderson, King, Krause
Others present: Park Board Representatives: John Ehn, Betty Wood, Ron Ladehoff, Gloria Dielschneider, Steve Hedlund, Kurt Steckelberg, and Rick Eckerman; Dave Burbach of Burbach Engineering; and Joel Danielson

The purpose of this special meeting was to listen to a presentation by Burbach Engineering from Plattville, Wisconsin, concerning the Family Aquatic Center. Dave Burbach gave the presentation.

The present pool holds 120,000 gallons of water and the new one would hold approximately 82,000 gallons of water with a recirculation rate of 335 gallons per minute.

The proposed Family Aquatic Center would have a 90-foot slide 14 or 15 feet tall with two loops using a 10-15 hp Purex pump. The cost of this slide would be \$37,000 unassembled. It would take approximately a week for 4-5 people to assemble this slide.

This pool would be 0 depth to 6 ft. deep. Diving is permitted in 6 ft. of water but Red Cross diving instructions would not be permitted unless it was 9 ft. deep.

In order to have a diving board the pool would need to be 11 feet deep. The Park Board has been receiving a lot of flak about no diving board being installed. Discussion was had about whether the community would prefer a slide or diving board.

The different filter systems were discussed.

The approximate cost of \$500,000 for the new Family Aquatic Center does not include construction for the bathhouse, demolition costs, construction for pump house, heater, assembling of the slide.

The timeframe for this new pool would be that a decision would have to be made this month for the plan for the pool, submit it to the Department of Health by September 1, public bidding 2 weeks later, hopefully do the vessel in the fall of 1995, fill with water by 12/95, erect the mechanical building by 12/95, energize the system 4/1/96 and grind the gutters,

etch and paint the bowl shortly thereafter, and do the deck in the spring of 1996.

Requested changes of Burbach Engineering included reversing the widths of the two ends so that the deeper end was wider than the shallow end, move the slide over a little so as to permit lap swimming, and move bathhouse to the east more to allow for more grass area.

The Park Board is going to figure out a final plan and Burbach will fax us his plan and more discussion will take place at the next regular council meeting.

Sanderson made a motion that the Ryken Engineering proposal be signed concerning the study for the waterwater treatment facility. Second by Case. Carried unanimously.

Motion to adjourn by Sanderson. Second by Case. Carried unanimously.
