Following the presentation by the Clerk of the foregoing facts and figures relative to the cost of oiling certain streets and avenues and the properties benefited thereby and the total number of benefits interested therein, the following resolution was presented to the Council:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF CONRAD, GRUNDY COUNTY, IOWA:

"That the proposed assessments for oiling Main Street from the C & N W Ry tracks North to Lillian Avenue (4 blocks), Center Street from Main Street east to Church Street (1 block), Church Street from Center Street north to Grundy Avenue (1 block), Grundy Avenue from Church Street west to Washington Street (2 blocks), and Washington Street from Grundy Avenue south to Center Street (1 block), or 9 blocks in all, which has been prepared by the Clerk and is now on file in his office, notices of which in compliance with the state law, be given all persons liable for such costs, be and the same is hereby levied against the property in accordance with the passage of this resolution, and all such assessments not paid within thirty days after the passage of this resolution shall be certified by the Clerk to the County Auditor as a Special Tax against the property."

J. L. Hesselhuus moved the adoption of this resolution, which was seconded by Ray Gravenstein.

On the roll being called, the following vote resulted: Ayes; Brockway, Gravenstein, & Hesselhuus.

Nays: None. Resolution was declared adopted.

Moved by J. L. Hesselhuus and seconded by Ray Gravenstein that the amount of each benefit be placed at \$3.70

Ayes: Brockway, Gravenstein, and Hesselhuus.  
Nays: None. Motion declared carried.

The matter of our 1938 Tax Budget Estimate was now considered by the Council. Moved by J. L. Hesselhuus and seconded by E. J. Brockway that the amount necessary to be raised by taxation for 1938 be estimated as follows; Consolidated, or General, Fund, \$3000.00; Cemetery Fund, \$150.00; and Waterworks Fund, \$375.00; and that the 26th day of July be set as the date for hearing any objections from taxpayers as to these amounts.

Moved by J. L. Hesselhuus and seconded by E. J. Brockway that F. A. Prescott be granted a 10 days or two weeks leave of absence during threshing from his duties as Town Marshall, and that Chas. Crouse be allowed to substitute for him as Night Watch during his absence. Carried.

Earl Newton, president of the Commercial Club, now appeared before the Council in the interests of the Home Merchants Carnival, which the Commercial Club is sponsoring on the evenings of July 22 & 23. Moved by E. J. Brockway and seconded by J. L. Hesselhuus that the Council grant permission to the Commercial Club to close Main Street on the evenings of the two days of the Home Merchants Carnival, providing it is strictly understood that the Commercial Club will furnish and pay for the necessary Police and will clean up all the streets used, after the Carnival, at their own expense. Carried.

Moved by Ray Gravenstein and seconded by E. J. Brockway that the Council send two delegates to the Annual Convention of the League of Iowa Municipalities to be held in Des Moines on Aug. 17-18-19. Carried.

Moved by E. J. Brockway and seconded by Ray Gravenstein that Mayor H. E. Frederick and Councilman J. L. Hesselhuus be named as these delegates. Carried.

Moved by Ray Gravenstein and seconded by J. L. Hesselhuus that R. C. Dickover, Water Supt., be granted permission to purchase a new hay rope--not to exceed 125 feet--for the Sewage Disposal Plant. Carried.

I. A. Cohen appeared before the Council and made oral objection to his Water Rent bill for the quarter ending July 1st, 1937. Referred to Water Com. Moved and seconded to adjourn. Carried.
