Councilman Gier reported that the information he had received relative to the Standard Oil Co. Ordinance was neither for or against the adoption of the ordinance which had been presented at the last meeting of the council.

Councilman Kauffman reported that he had seen Attorney Draper about the said ordinance and that he reported favorably on the ordinance.

Ordinance No. 53 was then read and on motion made by Tansey and seconded by Kauffman, it was moved that said Ordinance No. 53 be adopted.

The Mayor put the question and the vote was as follows; Ayes, Gier, Tansey, Wheeler, Kauffman, Rourke. Nays, None.

Motion was made by Gier and seconded by Tansey that the rules be suspended and that Ordinance be passed to the second and third reading and that said Ordinance No. 53 be adopted.
