The Council met in special session on Monday, June 27, 1955 with all council men present. H. D. Hunt, Clerk, was absent due to hospitalization. Mayor Clapsaddle appointed H. D. Martin to act as clerk pro-tem.

Paul Franzenburg Jr., W. W. King, and D. O. Clinite met with the council relative to the curbing and street situation on main street. After lengthy discussion on the problems involved the council took the problem under advisement for further study and legal information.

Mr. Hahn of the Hargraves Construction Company was in Conrad on June 24th checking on the condition of Conrad's streets. Mr. Hahn recommended that his company ship in a carload of seal coat oil and that his company seal coat as many blocks of the town's streets as far as the oil will go. Mr. Hahn's price to be 13¢ per square yard of seal coating, done. This includes a course of rock over the seal coat of oil. Mr. Hahn estimated that one car load of oil would do 15 to 20 blocks at an estimated cost not to exceed \$2000.

After lengthy discussion it was moved by Combs and seconded by Bone that we employ Hargraves Construction Company of Cedar Rapids to seal coat approximately 15 to 20 blocks of the city streets at 13¢ per square yard with the total expenditure not to exceed \$2000. Motion carried.

There being no further activities it was moved by Schultz and seconded by Bone to adjourn. Carried.
