

SPECIAL MEETING
May 22, 1978

A special meeting was called to order by Mayor Schleisman in the Council Chambers at 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of updating the work on Lillian Avenue, and the future of south Main Street.

Councilmen present: McLean, Moler, Graham.
Absent: Beeghly, Zern.

Others present: Dwayne Garber, Bob Kruse, Randy Daniel, Bill Hartwig, and Gary Blythe.

Dwayne Garber discussed with the council the progress of Lillian Avenue. It had been found that a gas main was going to have to be moved by Iowa Electric Light and Power Co. near the water tower before Bill Hartwig could lay his water lines in that area. It was agreed that Daniel will work with Hartwig on a temporary, part-time basis in conjunction with this water line.

Garber also brought some ideas as to what could be done on south Main Street. Moved by McLean and seconded by Moler that the City apply to the County Board of Supervisors for financial aid for this project, in consideration that this street is a farm-to-market road. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on the city obtaining a pull-type street sweeper. Beeghly had located a demonstrator in Des Moines that the city could try out if we provided transportation. It was agreed that the city would do so.
