

The meeting was then turned over to R. E. Schenk for the opening of the bids. These being opened and tabulated by Engineer and Clerk.

Motion by Koehler that Clerk be authorized to return checks of the highest bidders. Seconded by Combs. Carried.

The low bidder, Pederson & Associates of Waterloo, Iowa, was then told that the Town would have to await word from the Federal Government before officially accepting the bid.

Moved by Daggett, seconded by Combs, to purchase a triangular tract of land bounded by railroad right of way on south, sewage treatment plant site on east, and Hurlbutt property on the north, containing approximately one acre for \$500.00 per acre from Mrs. Vena Hurlbutt and Schenk Engineering Company is to survey tract for accurate size and description; it being further moved that Town accept transfer by deed from Mrs. Hurlbutt of 16 foot strip along south of plant site in exchange for 16 foot driveway along north of plant site; further moved that Town purchase a permanent easement for tile outlet in accordance with plans of sewage treatment plant from Mrs. Hurlbutt for \$25.00 and release present easement for present tile outlet; it being further understood that \$500.00 per acre price of triangular tract provides that town will construct and maintain a hog tight fence along north line of said tract.

Motion Carried.

Moved by Simms, seconded by Manning, that sanitary sewer be extended from corner of Center Street and Alice Street thence two blocks east to Wilson Street intersection, thence North to approximately Lot 5, Block 4 of Clark's Addition and that the Town Attorney and Clerk be authorized and directed to proceed with the necessary matters to accomplish a July 1st completion of this project.

Moved by Daggett to adjourn. Seconded by Manning. Carried.

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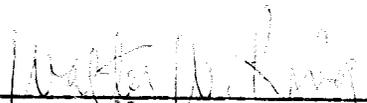
