Graham made a motion to accept the bills and that warrants be drawn on the same. Second by Lutes. Carried.

It was agreed upon by the council to send Frier to a street maintenance workshop in Ames the 6th of November at a cost of \$35.00.

Frier reported that he had checked on a switch to activate both wells in case of fire. The initial cost through General Telephone would be \$25.00 and \$5.00 a month. The installation charge would be approximately \$534.00.

The council gave Frier their okay to purchase a heat houser for the city tractor.

Pearl Miller presented the library's annual report, noting that circulation was up 45% over last year.

Mandatory garbage service was again discussed. Kliebenstein stated that this service could be made mandatory by simply adopting an ordinance. But first the council would need to decide if they would allow any exceptions and etc.

Dave Fox, of the Conrad Apartments Board of Directors, was present to present to the city the deed for the west half of the northern most block of Wilhelm St. and the north side of the adjoining half block of Lillian St. The council felt that this had somehow been overlooked in the past and should be accepted now. The deed will be prepared by Kirby Schmidt and filed at the court house by Don Kliebenstein. A resolution accepting the deed will be adopted at the regular November meeting.

Trick or Treat Night was set for Oct. 31st from 6 till 9 P.M.

Mayor Beeghly appointed Vane Graham as Mayor pro-tem.

The council authorized the clerk to decide after this months bills had been paid how much money would be available to invest in re-purchase agreements.

Dwayne Garber, of CGA, stated that Gene Blythe had been sent a letter stating that the street construction would be discussed at this meeting and as he wasn't present he evidently was no longer interested in construction of the block of Wilhelm between Center and Grundy this fall. Jerry Vinton stated that he was not in favor of that block of Wilhelm going in unless the rest of Wilhelm and Grundy from Washington to Wilhelm also go in at the same yime. He stated that he didn't think the one block would solve the drainage problem in his parking lot. The council was in agreement with Garber that it is getting too late to start anything this fall.

Motion to adjourn by Graham, second by Moler. Carried.
