The Conrad City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. in the Council Chambers on 12-23-96. Answering roll call was Dorothy King, Steve Mugge, Kenny Sanderson, and Kevyn Zacharias. Absent: Robert Lutes. Mayor Gearhart presided. Also present was City Clerk Denise Hoy, and Gary Moler.


Council accepted with regret the resignation of Verne Reece from the Historic Preservation Commission. Verne's term was to run until 12/31/98, in which Mayor Gearhart will fill the unexpired term. Mayor Gearhart then appointed Dave Brindle, and Tom Alexander to a three year term on the Commission to expire 12/31/99. He then reappointed Anne Carnes for another 3 year term to expire, 12/31/99.

Mayor Gearhart closed the regular session and opened a public hearing at 7:30 p.m. in regards to vacating Railroad Street. With no oral or written objections, the hearing was closed at 7:33 p.m. Motion by King, seconded by Sanderson to adopt resolution #125-12.96 "A RESOLUTION VACATING ALL OF RAILROAD STREET LOCATED IN BLYTHE'S COMMERCIAL ADDITION". Ayes: King, Sanderson, Zacharias, Mugge. Nays: none.

Mayor Gearhart again closed regular session and opened a public hearing at 7:40 p.m. in regards to abandoning all utility easements in Blythe's Commercial Addition. There was no written objections. Gary Moler made an oral comment in regards to his property located in the Commercial Addition. Gary was concerned about existing water lines and how the abandonment would effect them. Mayor Gearhart closed the public hearing and opened regular session. Council deferred any action on the resolution abandoning all utility easements in Blythe's Commercial Addition until January 13th, 1997.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
