

May 22, 2000

The Conrad City Council met in regular session on 5/22/00 in Council Chambers. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanderson and the Pledge of Allegiance was said. Answering roll call was Shauna Callaway, Robert Lutes, Steve Mugge, Lisa Purvis, and Lloyd Weber. Lisa Purvis took notes in the absence of City Clerk Denise Hoy.

Gary Mauer informed council of the County road construction projects for the next few years. D67 from Conrad to the Hardin County line will be resurfaced in the summer of 2001. Mauer suggested that if Council had any repairs such as water/sewer lines they should plan ahead and do them in conjunction with this project.

Lee Arends also presented Council with a "Best Concrete Slab bridge in 1999" plaque. The bridge was entered for this award by Gary Mauer last summer.

Fred Leytham discussed the Main Street lighting project with Council. He will be preparing and publishing the notice to bidders now that all the Waiver and Agreements have been signed by local business owners. Council decided to hold the beginning construction date off until after Black Dirt Days.

Motion by Purvis, seconded by Mugge to accept change order #1 for the Comet Bike Trail Extension. The change order will add \$39,707.20 and extend the trail from Oakland Trail Park to Reunion Park. Ayes 5.


Mayor Sanderson then opened the Public Hearing on the FY2000 Budget Amendment. With no oral or written comments, the public hearing was closed.

Motion by Mugge, seconded by Weber to adopt resolution # 106-5.00 "Approving the FY2000 Budget Amendment". Ayes: Weber, Callaway, Mugge, Purvis, Lutes.

Diana Ward presented a petition to Council, on behalf of 20 of the 23 Duesenberg Drive resident, against the curb and gutter project. The petition states "We the undersigned residents of Duesenberg Drive (and Reo Road), while being totally in favor of the repair of our street, oppose the addition of curb & gutter, which we feel is too costly and unnecessary". Council heard several comments from the citizens from Duesenberg Drive. Mayor Sanderson set an informational meeting on this project for June 1, 2000 at 7:30 p.m. at the American Legion building and encouraged all interested persons to attend.

Mugge motioned and Weber seconded to adjourn the meeting at 8:14 p.m.
